May 19 The Barn Nursery – 9510 Old Hwy 99, Tumwater. From Olympia, go South on Capitol Way > Old Hwy 99. The Barn is 3 miles past the Capitol Blvd & Tumwater Blvd intersection, on the LEFT (just past 93rd). View red barn building, water features, statuary, plants, outbuildings, old equipment... Rain or shine venue as they have a large covered area. Be mindful that this is a business, try not to block merchandise. Park in front of building to the left of nursery.

May 26 Lions Park – From Olympia, go East on 4th Ave. to RIGHT on Wilson St. (just past Ralph's Thriftway). Continue 3 blocks to park on LEFT. View grassy & treed park with play ground surrounded by quaint older homes. Parking on all four sides of park. Meet at covered area.

June 2 Schmidt House – 330 Schmidt Place, Tumwater. From Capitol Way, go West on Custer Way, turn RIGHT onto Schmidt Place. View historical home & grounds, statuary & rose garden. 'Setting up' under the veranda is permitted. House will be open. Lots of parking.

June 9 The Perennial Gardener - 5424 Boston Harbor Rd. NE. Plum St. > East Bay Dr. > Boston Harbor Rd. Go 4.5 miles past the Plum St. & State St. intersection to Nursery on RIGHT. View quaint nursery, old apple tree, large maple tree, old homes & buildings & lots of interesting stuff (little red wagons...). Be mindful of customers.

June 16 'Old' Capitol, 'Old' Library, First Christian Church & Olympia Copy & Printing... – From Olympia, go South on Capitol Way to LEFT on 7th to intersection of Franklin St. & 7th. View all of the above & 'Old' Olympian Hotel & Sylvester Park are just a block away. Parking & restrooms at the Church. Great opportunity to paint downtown. This is the location of OAL monthly meetings.

June 23 Lighthouse Bungalow – 1215 East Bay Dr. NE. Plum St. > East Bay Dr. 1st house on the LEFT (waterside) on East Bay Dr. View quaint bungalow, marina, Bay, lighthouses & mountains. Pull into circular driveway to unload your gear & then park on East side of East Bay Drive. This is available as a vacation rental. www.lighthousebungalow.com 754-0389.

June 30 State Capitol Museum – 211 W 21st Ave. From Olympia, go South on Capitol Way to RIGHT on 21st Ave. Museum is 3 blocks on the Left. View old mansion/museum, coach house, homes & grounds. Coach House behind the Museum is available for parking. Covered area is available so this is a rain or shine painting day.

July 7 Home of Marty Albee – 1938 Overhulse Rd. NW. From Harrison & Cooper Point, go West on Harrison, turn RIGHT onto Overhulse (just before overpass). Turn RIGHT on 20th & take 1st RIGHT into pasture parking. View trees, gardens, arbors, outbuildings, fields, llamas, chickens, goats... The Albee's host garden parties & events at their home. www.thealbees.com

July 14 Henderson House & Crosby House – 602 Deschutes Way SW & 703 Deschutes Way SW, Tumwater. View two historical homes/museums & log cabin or go down the hill to Tumwater Historical Park to view the ‘Old’ Brewery or start at the top of the Deschutes River & paint in the Deschutes Falls Park. Restrooms at the Historical Park.

July 21 West Bay Marina – From Olympia, take 4th Ave. or 5th Ave. West over the bridge & thru 1st roundabout to Olympic Way. At the second roundabout, turn RIGHT onto West Bay Dr. Follow West Bay Dr. along the waterfront to the end & Marina. View boats, old buildings, Bay & Marina activity. We will try to meet at the new viewing platform/deck to the left of main building.

July 28 Lattin Country Cider Mill & Farm – 9402 Rich Rd. SE. From Olympia, go South on Capitol Way > Hwy 99. Go 3.7 miles past Capitol Blvd & Tumwater Blvd intersection to Rich Rd. Turn LEFT onto Rich Rd. to ‘Lattin’ ½ mile on the RIGHT. View barns, animals, gardens, waterwheel & fields. Great cider & donuts made fresh daily.

August 4 Home of Cindy & David Fairbrook – 4432 Shellridge Rd. NW North on Hwy. 101 towards Shelton to Oyster Bay exit (just past Steamboat exit). Go 2.5 miles & take LEFT onto Shellridge (just past Ellison) & LEFT at last driveway just before cul-de-sac. Hilly driveway bends to the LEFT. Carpooling recommended. View lovely home, gardens, greenhouse, statuary, bridge, water feature, hillside pasture, llamas & Olympics.

August 11 Home of Cindy & David Fairbrook See above. *Here is an opportunity to do an in-depth study.*

August 18 Swantown Inn B & B, Nathan & Casey Allan – 1431 – 11th Ave. SE From Olympia, go East on 4th Ave. & take a RIGHT on Central St. & RIGHT on 11th to first house on LEFT. View Victorian mansion, gardens & gazebo. Home tours upon request. www.swantowninn.com

August 25 & 26 Cameron Gardens, Home of Diane Jacob – 5831 Steamboat Island Rd. Take Hwy 101 North towards Shelton & take Steamboat exit, go LEFT past stores & turn RIGHT onto Steamboat Island Rd. Go 3 miles, turn LEFT at mailbox 5831 (look for ‘Artists’ sign). Follow gravel road to meadow parking. View geodesic dome home, large lush flower gardens, pathways, fruit trees, birdhouses, water feature surrounded by woods, soft music drifts as we paint. www.camerongardens.com *Please note the two days available for in-depth study*

Sept. 1 Ashley Creek Farm – 9221 Littlerock Rd. SW. From Trosper Rd., go South on Littlerock Rd. Farm entrance on RIGHT just before 93rd (across from Texaco Station). Long private drive. View farmhouse, barn, territorial views, cottage, spring, fish hatchery, outbuildings, large trees & crops. www.ashleycreek.com

Sept. 8 Ashley Creek Farm See above. *Here is an opportunity to do an in-depth study.*

Sept. 15 The Barn Nursery – See May 19th for directions. This is a rain or shine location.

NOTE: This year there are five new locations and four opportunities to visit a location twice allowing for in-depth studies.
