
## **Chris Maynard**

will be our OAL March speaker.

Using a small scalpel as his primary tool, artist Chris Maynard carves artwork out of feathers giving them new life on a canvas.

"Each feather, though dead and discarded, keeps something of the bird's essence," Maynard tells us.

Indeed, the colorful and sometimes humorous creations highlight the feather's beauty but also encourages us to ponder the life of its previous owner.



"Since I work mostly with shed feathers, some of the birds that grew them are likely still living," adds Maynard.

He has worked with feathers since he was twelve and his unique feather shadowboxes are recognized by art collectors, bird lovers,, and a wide and interesting variety of people from around the world.



He only has time to turn a small portion of his ideas, which fill many notebooks, into his shadowbox feather designs. His favorite tools are the tiny eye surgery scissors, forceps, and magnifying glasses passed down through his family.

Maynard combines his strong backgrounds in biology and ecology into not only his art, but also a tabletop book and engaging and informative talks.

### Bill McEnroe passed away at the end of January.

One such critique included a line I'll always remember "That was a murderously unfortunate choice of color." I know I would never have explored various techniques and styles without Bill's prompting and assignments. Bill loved painting so much and was doing so up until a few months before his death at 93. Pretty good example I'd say. I learned so much from him and I will miss him terribly, but I do have his voice in my head, guiding as I continue exploring on my art path.



There are many methods to printing art but this was the first time I have seen such an easy way of removing ink from the inking plate for your design and then rolling off a single print. April even used flattened forsythia to add interest and color to the monotype. April teaches art to children and adults in Edmonds.

What is the hot seller? The new "In?" Have you been reading art blogs from art marketing gurus who try to tell you what you need to create? Do you choose your subject, style or medium by what the market is buying? Do you choose your pigment based on current color trends?

Remember that we live in a big world. There are many people in this world and each person brings a set of interests and tastes to the table. If you love something, be it a theme or subject in art, I'm willing to bet that you have a following "out there." There is a market for any type of art you can think of! The hard part is reaching followers or helping them find you.

I firmly believe that any theme or subject under the sun can find a following, so what should you choose. The answer is simple! Paint what you LOVE! Paint the style, the colors, the medium, the subject that makes you excited. It will show in your work and give you the enthusiasm you need to keep creating.

Don't be afraid to stay on your path. You must be dedicated in order for something to catch on. You must be willing to share and spread your visual message to the world. Continually jumping from one boat to another will likely not get you very far. Stay the course! You never know what will happen in the future and you won't find out if you switch directions at the drop of a hat!

# Executive Mansion and the Ted Rand Exhibit

Until May 2015, the Governor's Mansion features, in its gallery, **Ted Rand** (1915-2005) with 14 of his paintings on display. Ted Rand taught at U of WA, was a prolific portrait artist, early graphic artist for department stores Frederick & Nelson/Bon Marche, and illustrated 78 children's books including the successful *Salty Dog* series.

Tours of the Governor's Mansion are given only on Wednesday, and are staffed by volunteers. It is fun to see the lovely rooms and all the beautiful antiques and furnishing in the mansion and to hear the history. The mansion is maintained through private funds via The Governor's Mansion Foundation. Not to be missed is a portrait of George Washington by renowned early American artist **Rembrandt Peale** who painted our first president from life at age 17 and then, based on his early sketches and notes, went on to paint over 70 more portraits of him over the years.

Throughout the public rooms of the executive mansion you will find both vintage and modern work of Washington State artists. Our own **Pat Keith** has exhibited five original paintings in the mansion starting in Governor Gregoire's era and currently provides the mansion, as donation, with greeting cards based on her watercolor work. All proceeds go to the Governor's Mansion Foundation for facility maintenance.


We depart from Lacey Park & Ride on Martin Way at 9:20 a.m. And arrive at TAM, 10:10AM.
