"My work has been called dreamlike, but a truer statement would be to say *non-linear*; I take familiar images and put them together in an unusual way. My goal is not

to reproduce the past, but to represent the present. It is my



hope that the viewer finds my images to be an alchemical source of spiritual renewal and inspiration. "

She was born in Greenwich Village, NY to creative parents; her father a writer and her mother a ballet dancer. They exposed her to the all of the arts . She trained as a ballet dancer and tried her hand writing for her father's publication, Otto Scott's Compass, until deciding that image making was her first love.

Upon graduation from a technical design college, she decided against the corporate world and no-

ticed that her fine art skills were not where they needed to be to make a living as an artist. She didn't want to design on the computer as she found that physicality putting paint on canvas was compelling.

She went back to the realm of fine art and studied classical painting techniques with former teachers, later shared her passion for beautiful images as an art docent in the Lake Washington school district. Later she continued her studies in drawing and painting with Tenaya Sims, founder of the Georgetown Atelier. She said, "I learned the lost art of drawing, turning the form, and mixing Renaissance colors. Also the crucial placement of light and shadow; cast shadows and core shadows. The takeaway moment was when I realized that a superb-

It takes being away from civilization to become aware of just how much you are being bombarded. It is no wonder that humanity feels frustration, exhaustion, and is unable to fulfill their dreams. John P. Weiss a fellow artist wrote, "Seek stillness. It is the antithesis to the noise, voices, competition, hopelessness, pettiness and negativity to which we are exposed. So the answer to the madness is stillness. Nature seems to have this all figured out. It's why we stop and stare at a waterfall. Or gaze, speechless, at the immensity of a redwood tree. Why we love to walk beside frothy foam on the beach. There is stillness on a Saturday morning, sipping coffee with a cat on your lap. A summer of stillness restores me. But you might not have a boat and time to escape so what can you do to renew your creative batteries? You are so blessed to live in one of the most beautiful places on earth. Take time to see it! Seek Stillness. Go for a walk around Capitol Lake and find a bench to sit on for a few moments of stillness. Visit Tumwater Falls and recharge as all that energy is dispersed into the air. Drive to the Olympics and take a walk breathing in the beauty and the sounds of stillness.

Embrace mental downtime. From Scientific American: "Downtime replenishes the brain's stores of attention and motivation, encourages productivity and creativity, and is essential to both achieve our highest levels of performance and simply form stable memories in everyday life."

Seek moments of Stillness and when you have recharged come and help Olympia Art League to be an even more amazing group by adding your creative input.

SEP 3 MUD BAY (BLUE HERON BAKERY)

100 Brown Farm Rd NE – Olympia n Located 8 miles NORTHEAST of Olympia. From I-5 SOUTHBOUND, take Exit 114. Make right at the traffic light; go under the freeway and make a right into the Refuge. Follow the entrance road to the two public parking lots. n From I-5 NORTHBOUND, take Exit 114. Turn LEFT at stop sign; go under freeway and make right into the Refuge. Follow the entrance road to the two public parking lots. Visitor Center has a covered area, if weather is questionable. Good walking boardwalk with area to stop and do art. Daily fee is \$3, or free with Golden Eagle Pass.

SEP 17 BLACK LAKE BIBLE CAMP

6521 Fairview Rd S – Tumwater From **Capitol Way** and **Trosper Rd**, go WEST on **Trosper (54th Ave SE**). Continue on Trosper to 4-way stop. Turn LEFT onto **Black Lake Blvd** and **Belmore Rd**. Pass Black Lake Elementary School. AT stop sign, turn RIGHT. At the curve, take RIGHT into the Camp. Continue and park at the parking lot. We will need to sign in at the office.




James Krug Now at Artist's Gallery
