


### **MOLLY MURRAH**

Molly Murrah is an experienced, freelance graphic designer and watercolor artist who has lived and worked in the Seattle area since 1982. After graduating from Bucknell University in Pennsylvania a fine art major, Molly was employed at three New York City design companies working on various projects for corporate clients.

Her experience includes designing, producing and managing integrated marketing, corporate identity, advertising, and sales promotion campaigns. She has also designed over 40 children's books.

Her first experience with watercolors was on a painting trip to Greece in 1997 with local artist, Caroline Buchanan. She has studied with other well-known watercolor artists and instructors including Deanne Lemley, Kay Barnes, Ted Nuttall, Thomas Schaller, Mark Mehaffey, Donna Zagotta and Janet Rogers.





A Signature Member of the Northwest Watercolor Society (NWWS) — one of the top watercolor societies in the country —Molly was the society's 2013-2014 President and is currently involved in various marketing, website and workshop activities, including the design and production of a 128-page retrospective book on the society.

Molly's strengths as an artist lie in composition, color harmonies, and the representation of light. These skills have been greatly influenced — and honed — by her years of experience as a graphic designer. Continuing to work as both a designer and artist, Molly finds the balance between the two very fulfilling and always engaging

Of her work, Molly says, "My main goals for each painting are to design an engaging composition, select harmonious colors, achieve dramatic contrasts between lights and darks, and create a mood or feeling that draws in the viewer. If I convey this in my work, then I have succeeded in my artistic expression."

# Lakefair Juried Art Show ... an Artistic Opportunity

While having family and friends allows us to feel loved and appreciated, our support groups often cripple our advancement as an artist. Family and friends will rarely tell us that our work is awful even if they think so. They will tell us how marvelous our work is and how talented we are, mainly to be encouraging and polite. It is easy to start believing that we are great artists if we listen to those we love. How can we understand where we really are in our art journey?

The solution is to see our work next to other artists' works. Only then can we see our work in proper context. I am not referring to where we stand in the art world pecking order! This is about seeing how we can improve our own work and identify the direction in which we want to go.

A mixed art juried show is the perfect venue for this self-realization. We need to provide constructive criticism for **ourselves** and this happens when our art hangs with those of others. What may seem pretty good at home takes on a whole new view hanging in an art show!

The success of an art piece is determined by its ability to connect with others. Not every art viewer can buy, but everyone can show interest if a painting engages them. Enter a juried art show and watch your art at work. Observe what people do when they get near your art. Do they walk by...or stop. If they stop to look and linger for a while you will know you have attracted their attention and made a connection.

Acknowledging that our art skills could be better is the first step to progress. Find art in the show that you think is better than yours and ask why and learn. Other artist's work can encourage and motivate us to improve, enabling us to grow.

Participating in exhibitions of any size will give us focus. Having a deadline and goal will help us to be productive artists. Without a time deadline our mental masterpieces languish and never become reality. The 2016 Lakefair Juried Show has a deadline of May 27th. A juried show requires that you submit your very best art. 

### MARCH SPEAKER--ETHAN HARRINGTON

The fun and artistic energy was palpable as Ethan Jack Harrington painted an oil portrait of his model Jennifer during the March Olympia Art League meeting. Ethan laughed and enjoyed himself as he quickly covered his canvas with thin oils. The paints were mixed with Gamblin, a solvent-free gel that helps the oils dry quickly. As the painting began to "speak" to him he used thicker paint applications for detail and texture. Ethan's pallet is limited and he painted the entire painting with just one #10 Bright oil brush.

It was hard to believe that Artist Harrington had once been a shy painter. As a younger painter painting at night, away from too many prying eyes, Ethan developed a wonderful understanding of the importance of value in composition. Today he still would rather paint Plein Air and he uses the outdoor public contact to promote his art. Painting from actual objects rather than from photos allows Ethan to use the spatial relationship between himself and his subject to determine colors, temperature and perspective.

Ethan encouraged the OAL members to ask questions and we learned about his youth and painting history as he talked and painted. When asked what subjects sell best Ethan Harrington said, "Whatever you love at the moment and put lots of energy into will sell! Buyers can feel the excitement of that energy and they will love it too."

Thank you Ethan.... for coming all the way down from Seattle to share your talent and love of art with our group.

## Abstract Critique Group




