Apríl Presenter...

Abstract Painter Jeff Pasek

While earning his BA in Philosophy in the mid 90's, Jeff began to turn to painting with a serious energy and devotion. After many years as a dedicated, largely self-taught painter, he earned his Master of Fine Arts degree from Kent State University in December, 2013.

In 2014 he moved from Ohio to Olympia to continue his artistic career in the Pacific Northwest. Inspired by the beauty of this region, he enthusiastically creates, shows and sells his work. Jeff also teaches painting and drawing courses at South Puget Sound Community College's School of Continuing Education.

In his artist's statement Jeff says, "Every moment is improbable and strange... in these energetic abstracted landscapes, I seek to convey the deep mystery beneath human experience. I depict spaces containing a chaotic energy – a field from which enigmatic forms emerge and evoke a sense of presence. These paintings hint at sublime forces not directly seen, yet which underlie every conscious moment."

He calls this body of work *UnLands* which will be featured in an upcoming one man show at the Washington Center, May19th – June 26th.









Inspiring Your Happy Artist

Are you a Happy Artist? The kind of happy that makes you smile when you put your head on your pillow at night. That subtle feeling of contentment. That feeling that you've contributed something unique to the creative conversation. If not, perhaps these 5 suggestions will help you get there.

- 1. Feed your Inner Artist: Take time to study and absorb the works of masters in your field. Discover what you like, and what does not work for you. Visit galleries, view videos, read technique books, take a workshop. Think about how you can add the elements you like to your arsenal of creativity.
- 2. Practice your Craft: It's not just about getting better or creating more stuff, it's also about doing what you were meant to do. It's about honoring that little creative voice inside of you that refuses to be buried beneath the incessant demands of everyday life.
- 3. Put your Work out there: It's not enough to paint something and then toss it in your attic. You have to share what you create. In this day and age of blogs and social media and OAL opportunities, there is really no excuse not to get your work out there.
- 4. Connect and Inspire: As important as it is to get your own work out there in order to receive feedback, you also need to find a way to provide feedback to other artists as well. This is a two way street and you'll soon discover that the amount of feedback you receive is equal to the amount of feedback and encouragement that you offer to others.
- 5. Share, then let it go: Don't worry if it's good enough or whether it's better or worse than what you've done before. Your job is simply to create it, put it out there, and then move on. Your work is your work; it's not who you are or what you might become. It's not the final word on your creative potential; it's simply the next milepost on your creative journey.

March Presenter Ron Stocke Blends Charm and Inspiring Technique





Ron Stocke was a huge hit with Olympia Art League artists when he joined us at our March general meeting. His style, loosely representational, included techniques that many of our artists aspire to.

Ron started at the top of the paper and worked his way down, preserving dynamic shapes and targeting great value changes. He likes working back and forth between warm and cool colors and advised us to "keep the corner boring" so the viewer's interest would stay in the painting. Ron likes to paint city scenes which include people and have a brightly contrasting light source.

Ron Stocke will be the judge for our ArtsWalk Juried Show at the end of this month. He will also be teaching a two day workshop on the Tuesday and Wednesday preceding our Juried Show.


