September speaker Anita H. Lehmann explores...

Design Elements in Watercolor

Anita H. Lehmann is a teacher, an artist and an award winning architectural illustrator. She is a registered architect in the state of Washington. After receiving her Master's of Architecture at the University of Washington, she has taught freehand drawing in Rome, Civita and in Seattle. She currently offers small group classes in drawing, painting, and design. Her other skills include architectural design, graphic design, community planning and design illustration. Prior to receiving the 2013 Civita Insti-



tute Fellowship, Anita was a graduate student teacher at the University of Washington Rome Center, in Rome, Italy in 1985. Anita brings over 30 years experience in teaching design and drawing.

Of her work Anita says, "Drawing is about attempting something beyond language and beyond representation. I connect with the world and experience life. Mine is the hand of a practiced artist who has spent thousands upon thousands of hours honing my tool. My

pencil is a baton; the goal is to wield it as effortlessly as most people breathe. I strive for humor, humility, work ethic, and confidence."

In her presentation at the September meeting, Anita will talk about her design process in watercolor. She'll be focusing on design elements specifically applying a 'depictive' and 'evocative' practice.

Don't Wait.... Start it Now!

"It's a terrible thing, I think, in life to wait until you're ready. I have this feeling now that actually no one is ever ready to do anything. There's almost no such thing as ready. There's only now. And you may as well do it now...... I do think that, generally speaking, now is as good a time as any." (Hugh Laurie)

Procrastination is a subject of which I am an authority. Procrastination ruins careers, saps energy and hinders creativity. So debilitating is procrastination, so difficult to overcome, that it requires step by step action. In Painter's Keys, Robert Genn has offered a step-by-step solution to help us "get going!"

First, you need a symbol. This symbol is the circle. The circle means that you can start any process at any point. Draw a large circle and pin up the circle in your work area. It will serve as a reminder that you do not need to wait until you feel ready or prepared, just jump in and begin!

Then you need a motivational statement of: "There is always now," is one of the best. It should be printed out big and hung on your easel. "Do it now," and "Simply begin," are others.

Next you need a verbal statement, an affirmation of intention and commitment. Open your window or door and shout to the world..... "today I am going to paint!"

Then you need a retreat. For most of us it's right here in our studios. We artists have a deep need to become one with our work — unsullied, un-tempted, unspotted and uninterrupted. Incidentally, genuine contemplation-time is not procrastination. It's a part of working. When you are properly in retreat your work grabs you.

Finally you need a begin button. "Start" can be simply when you turn on your favorite music. Music that encourages marching or dancing is good — it gets you moving. Incidentally, when you turn the music off — you can be off as well. You're outta here. One day at a time. Ready??? GO!

Amy Fisher's May Presentation Delights Members

The audience was delighted and responsive to the May meeting presenter, Amy Fisher, who is also a long-time member of the Olympia Art League. Her presentation included samples of her work spanning several decades including two examples of the four posters she was commissioned to do for the Washington State Fish and Wildlife Department in 1995.

Amy has been a lifelong artist after graduating from the University of Idaho in 1974 with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in painting. She has illustrated several field guides on birds and mammals, as well as commissions for large corporations, including Boeing, Coca Cola, Pepsi and numerous hotel chains.

Her presentation included several examples of her current exploration into semi- abstraction in which she paints a large fairly realistic water color which she then cuts into smaller rectangles. These smaller pieces she then modifies as to composition and color and then rearranges them back into the larger painting in a more random way so as to create an interesting semi-abstract composition.



Amy is currently teaching a weekly watercolor class focused on helping students to first gain a solid foundation in composition and color, and then explore their own style and creative expression. During the summer, Amy conducted plein air sessions. Amy's students will be showing their work during the fall Arts Walk, October 6-7, at Chinese Healing Arts 606 Columbia St SW.




