




January speaker...

Watercolor Artist Sherri Bails

In her artist's statement, Sherri Bails says, "My watercolors are meant to bring fun into your life. The thrill of a challenge drives me to pick up a paintbrush...not only the challenge of subject matter, but also how best to tell that subject's story, often using shapes and symbols to show meaning and bring a sense of sophisticated whimsy to every piece. I am here to awaken the need for fun in everyone's life in a lovely way."

Her newer style is more challenging from a design standpoint as the execution is more graphic and precise. It's helped her loosen up when she paints in a more traditional style.

In her presentation at the January meeting, Sherri will show how she goes about deciding what to paint; then she'll demonstrate her process. She'll also talk about her thoughts as an art teacher. She's shown her work extensively, been a juror and taught at the elementary, junior high and university levels since receiving her B.S. from Northern Illinois University in art education.

November speaker...

Robyn Chance

Brings Subjects to Life



Robyn Chance spoke about Golden Open Acrylics at the November meeting. These paints dry faster than oil and much slower than regular acrylics. They contain natural pigments for rich nontoxic colors that

blend beautifully. Golden Open Acrylic Medium and Open Acrylic Thinner may be used with any acrylic paint and will extend drying "open" time without sacrificing quality.

Robyn stressed that values in any painting are critical. "Where is the dark? Where is the light?" She also firmly stated that shadows "are not black". Shadows are composed of the subject color mixed with its compliment (opposite color on the color wheel).



Robyn very patiently uses up to 30 translucent coats of paint to give her subject lifelike color nuances, texture and depth. Her portraits have great personality and always make an emotional connection with the viewer.
