AWARD WINNING ARTIST

DIANNA SHYNE

Multiple award winning artist Dianna Shyne is our presenter for the May meeting. Pursuing her passion for art, she's spent thirty years working in acrylic, oil and watercolor. She studied 15 years with renowned Russian Impressionist teachers including Ron Lukas, William Reese and Del Gish.

Dianna has exhibited her work in over 40 solo and two person exhibitions, and won more than a dozen top national awards. She has also given classes and demonstrations locally, around the country and in Canada, Italy and China. She is currently teaching classes around Washington State. To Dianna, teaching is a joy as well as an art, conveying not only theoretical art concepts but also delving into the deeper issues of creativity and the ongoing artistic journey, Dianna's classes are both informative and inspirational. Dianna is a member of Women Painters of Washington and a signature member and past president of the Northwest Watercolor Society.

Richly textured surfaces, compelling compositions, and dynamic color interplay form the basis of Dianna's unique style. From luminous dripping washes to impasto palette knife and painterly brush strokes, Dianna's paintings tap into her Russian Impressionist training to evoke the passage of light and unspoken emotion.

Of her work, Dianna says, "I love everything about painting...the weight and feel of the brush in my hand, that initial squeeze from a new tube of paint, the first

stroke on a fresh canvas, the moment when I lock into that timeless place of absorption, or that one perfect elusive stroke. Painting is a delight, a meditation and practice in present moment awareness. It is also an opportunity for me to communicate my love of life with others."





May 24 - Marathon Park

From downtown, take State Ave (one-way westbound). Stay in LEFT lane. After a curve it is a two-way road, 4th Avenue W. Turn LEFT at stoplight (Simmons St), corner of Bayview Market. Go one block and turn RIGHT onto 5th Avenue W, continuing around lake. Roadway becomes Deschutes Parkway. Marathon Park is at the railroad tracks. Plenty of different views to choose from.

9510 Old Highway 99 SE

Deschutes Parkway

May 31 - Barn Nursery

From Olympia, go SOUTH on Capitol Blvd SE (turns into Old Highway 99 SE). The Barn Nursery is 3 miles past the intersection of Capitol Blvd SE & Tumwater Blvd SE, on the LEFT. View red barn building, water features, statuary, plants, etc. Rain or shine, as they have a large covered area. Be mindful that this is a business – please do not block merchandise. Park in front of the building to the left of the Nursery.

928 Overhulse Rd. NW

June 7 - Home of Marty Albee

Drive WEST on Harrison Ave. Turn RIGHT onto Overhulse Rd NW (just before the Highway 101 overpass). Turn RIGHT on 20th Lane NW and take RIGHT into pasture parking. View trees, gardens, arbors, animals, etc.

9402 Rich Rd. SE

June 14 - Lattin's Cider Mill

I-5 SOUTH to Tumwater Blvd. Go LEFT over freeway to Capitol Blvd. Turn RIGHT and go 3 miles past Olympia Airport to Rich Road SE. Turn LEFT at Rich Road, drive ¹/₂ mile to Lattin's, on right.

June 21 - Mud Bay

From Highway 101 WEST, take 2nd Ave SW Exit. Sharp RIGHT onto Mud Bay Rd NW. View Mud Bay, shoreline, Black Hills, path that leads to the Bay (which is sort of scruffy, but some good views of the water). Good views both sides of street. Parking available in Buzz's Bar & Grill lot.

June 28 - West Bay Marina

From downtown Olympia, take State Avenue NE (one way) going WEST (at waterfront, short LEFT [Water St] then RIGHT over 4th Ave W bridge. Stay in RIGHT LANE up hill. At second roundabout, take first exist onto West Bay Drive NW. Drive along inlet to the end. Watch for signs West Bay Marina and Tugboat Annie's Restaurant with parking on the RIGHT. View of inlet. marina and lots of boats.

July 5 - Evergreen Lavender Farm

Fee: \$5. Per Person. Yelm Highway to Meridian Rd SE. Turn RIGHT onto Meridian Rd SE (which does a bit of meandering) to Evergreen Valley Rd SE. Turn LEFT onto Evergreen Valley Rd SE. Short distance (1/3 mi?) down road – look for signage. Drive around to back of Farm. Gate will be open for us.

July 12 - Spurgeon Creek Estates 9407 Crete St SE Olympia I-5 SOUTH to 93rd Ave Exit. Go LEFT over freeway and stay 93rd ave. to Old 99. Turn RIGHT and go 2.1 miles to Rich Road SE. Turn, LEFT at Rich Road SE, Turn RIGHT onto Crete St SE. In 600ft turn right onto Crete St SE. In about 500ft is the location. The

SOUTH on Littlerock Road SW. Enter property on RIGHT, just past 93rd St. (Texaco Gas Station). Long private drive opens to view of the farm.

1431 11th Ave. SE

9221 Littlerock Rd. SW

July 26 - Swantown Inn & Spa

I-5 South to Plum St exit. RIGHT onto Union. 0.2 miles, RIGHT onto Eastside St SE. 300ft, LEFT onto 11th Ave SE. 0.3 miles and the house is the last house on the right on the corner of 11th and Central. Parking is up the driveway. If it is full than you can park on Central. Wonderful old Victorian house that has been turned into a Bed and Breakfast. Plenty of small gardens and a gazebo and of course the Victorian house itself.

August 2 - Priest Point Park Rose Garden 2600 East Bay Dr. N Olympia

From I-5 south. Take Plum St exit. Stay on Plum. When it crosses State St NE, it turns into East Bay Drive. 1.8 miles the park entrance in on your right. Take the road up to the left to the parking lot. The rose gardens are on the right.

August 9 - Panorama Pea Patch

Martin Way to Sleater-Kinney Rd SE. Go SOUTH on Sleater-Kinney, through Pacific Avenue and 14th St. At 500' after 14th St, turn LEFT onto Circle Lane. Follow Circle Lane through traffic circle to Circle Loop. Continue to 2nd entry to parking lot of the Agua Fitness Center. Gate at right rear of parking lot leads to Pea Patch Garden, across the street.

1751 Circle Lane SE

August 16 - Nisqually Wildlife Refuge

Located 8 miles NORTHEAST of Olympia. From I-5 SOUTHBOUND, take Exit 114. Make RIGHT at the traffic light at the end of the exit ramp; go under the freeway and make a right into the Refuge. Follow the entrance road to the two public parking lots. From I-5 NORTHBOUND, take Exit 114. Turn LEFT at stop sign; go under freeway and make right into the Refuge. Follow the entrance road to the two public parking lots. Visitor Center has a covered area, if weather is guestionable. Good boardwalk with areas to stop and do art. Daily fee is \$3, or free with Golden Eagle Pass.

August 23 - West Bay Park

From Capitol and 5th Ave in downtown Olympia, go WEST 5th ave. At the roundabout, take the second exit onto Olympic Way NW. 700ft. at the roundabout, take the first exit onto West Bay Dr. NW. 0.4 miles the entrance to the park in on the RIGHT. Views of the capitol, and the waterway across from the marina.

August 30 - Cameron Gardens

Go toward Shelton on Highway 101 North. Turn RIGHT on Steamboat Island exit, then make an immediate left at the end of the exit ramp. Then turn RIGHT on to Steamboat Island Rd. Stay on Steamboat Island Rd NW for about 3 miles. Look for a cluster of address boards on the left side of the road, a little bit past the Saw Shop. The owner puts out an Olympia Art League sign usually before we arrive. Turn LEFT down gravel road, through woods. Park in pasture.

Sept. 6 - Pam and James Giovannini's

I-5 South to the Trosper Rd SW exit. RIGHT onto Trosper Rd SW. It will become 54th Ave SW. At the end it will turn RIGHT and become Trosper Rd SW again. The road will bend to the LEFT and become 49th Ave SW. 0.5 miles the property is on your LEFT. There is a small wooden sign that reads FINE ART FRAMING MATTING. Turn into the drive and continue to back of property. There is barn, fields with cows and horse. Plenty of pastures and trees.
