
Presenting March Artist...

Sumi-e Artist Karen Dedrickson





SNOWBOUND MUSINGS

With all these snow days I had to do something with my time. I got this urge to start organizing my art supplies, old paintings, art books, and finally my resource file. I had a rather large collection of my own photos, clippings, and various bits and pieces for use as references. They really needed to be categorized if I ever hoped to use them in my paintings. It is a constant struggle to keep them in order, but when I do it is a joy to have that resource.

After reviewing my older photos, I know now I would photograph a bit differently. I have made the mistake of placing the subject smack in the middle of the photo. As you know, that is not how to compose art. Tricking my eyes into a different composition is a challenge. The photo dominates my brain, and try as I might, it is difficult to change it.

I've learned that the first decision when using a photo reference is to conscientiously create an improved picture and develop your painting. Pay attention to the little details. Refine the creation by eliminating excess line, color, and perhaps even a few trees. Your creation is a choice of inclusion and elimination. I've a long way to go, but I do have that goal.

I've picked up so many similar tips and insights from OAL's Watercolor Critique Group. It actually gets me going when I know that our critique group will meet and I need to have a painting to share. If I'm short on inspiration, the group often has a challenge—a subject that will be the burr under my saddle. Quite literally, it will annoy the heck out of me so I finally give it a try. It is not my favorite pursuit, but it pushes me out of my comfort zone. Oddly enough it was the challenge of painting a bird that produced my first sale.

I hope you have sought out a small group within our organization. If nothing else, meet up with your interest "tribe". Savor the time you spend together talking about your art pursuits. You may even have the bonus of forming good friendships in the process.

February's speaker...

CELENE RYAN OAL MEMBER AND WATER COLOR ARTIST

Celene is bravely taking her painting to a new level. Her white flowers have touches of red, yellow, blue and green in the petals to bring depth and give roundness to their shape. She showed us that white flowers are anything but "white".



She uses negative painting to make images pop. Darks are achieved by numerous

washes of paint in increasing value. Texture is added with the use of salt, crumpled plastic wrap or wax paper laid on damp paint, and use of masking fluid. She uses stencils as a guide to lift paint and 'find' shapes in the darker areas.



Celene is currently experimenting with layering acrylic paint or ink over dry watercolor and texturizing it with crumpled wax paper. This method adds texture and additional light spaces in her work. It works particularly well when painting fur or rock textures, as she demonstrated for us. Negative painting enhances the texture.

Her Mt. Rainier home and gallery in L.B. Junction, near Elbe, provide a peaceful setting for her artistic talents. Her paintings are fresh and colorful—a joy to see. She said, "Art carries you through life. It's always there for you."



Sun's "Harmony" placed 1st and was awarded "Best of Show" at the 2013 Associated Arts of Ocean Shores Exhibition. In 2017 all six entries received awards. Sun was born in South Korea, moved to the USA in 1976 and is a longtime resident of Olympia.
