November presenter...

Wire Sculptor Elizabeth Berrien



Elizabeth Berrien is our guest speaker for the November meeting, our last meeting of the year. In anticipation of her presentation, Elizabeth shared her art journey. "In high school, I dreamed of the beauty of animals but couldn't translate their energy lines on paper. My efforts to draw were clumsy; I wasn't aware that I was left-handed. My teacher, Ken Curran, kept throwing new materials at me 'til something clicked. Wire clicked big. It was an ink line I could form directly with my hands. I taught myself to draw in three dimensions.

"I followed the wire, and became a pioneer in the field of contemporary wire sculpture. I explored and invented. Thirty-seven years later, I'm still at

it. I've been immersed in the exploration of wire sculpture for two-thirds of my life. When I look back across the curve of time, I see a line of progress and discovery, trial and error. When I see a sculpture I made, I remember my feelings about the creature in question. I remember what was going on emotionally in my life while I twisted those wires.

"The animals themselves have always been the major element of my life; I've always had an affinity for nature. I'll never stop studying the way animals move, their elusive spark of spirit and nature. The animals are telling me it's time to blur some boundaries and travel new paths. There is something in the nature of Guardianship involved. As I weave my sculptures, I infuse them with the intent to bring you peace, strength, health and well-being.

"Fifteen years into the process, I achieved sufficient mastery to weave with a sense of absolute freedom and spontaneity. I started to work smoothly and rhythmically. If I focused on just following the lines that defined an animal, the hidden inner structure would take care of itself.

"The sculptures are a source of ongoing adventure. Large commissions take me all over the world. There's nothing half as lively as traveling with a life sized bear, giraffe or dolphin checked as oversized baggage..."

The Evolution of an Artist

Cal Capener, our speaker at the October meeting, shared his path from a childhood love of drawing to his current successful oil paintings. His motivation for continual growth has been his deep admiration for the past and present "greats" of oil painters.



Always happy to learn, Cal has studied with several well-known artists. He also

has tremendous observational skills and carefully studies famous paintings. He takes note of brush strokes, color combinations, and composition in famous pieces, and then applies those principals to benefit his own paintings.



Cal's art path has moved through mastery of drawing, photography, and painting in abstract, realistic, and impressionist styles. His art has sold and won awards in all these styles.

One of Cal's big take-away from his studies has been to create slowly and to take time thinking through all the necessary steps to a successful art piece. He shared the "Rule of 10" which states that the activities we choose at the age of 10 are the things we will enjoy for our lifetime. He said if we haven't continued doing what we loved at age 10, we are "missing the boat".

This interest may be due to my strong printmaking background."
