The facility enjoys working with OAL to promote local artists. They came up with a great plan—Olympics West will host an online art auction. Olympia Art League members can help by donating a piece of art to be auctioned at the online event. Proceeds from the art sales will be used to fund different local charities like Meals on Wheels. This is a great way for the Olympia Art League to stay connected with our local community during these trying times. Rick will be donating two paintings to the event.

To participate drop off your art on Saturday, September 12 from 11am -1pm.

- To drop off your art, enter the parking lot off of Trosper Rd SW.
- Go left to the center entrance doors with the overhang.
- Corp Of Table To Tabl
- Stop at the entrance and open your vehicle, they will remove your donated art.
- If you need to get out to open your vehicle, please wear a mask and maintain a 6 ft. distance by stepping away from your vehicle while the art is removed.
- After removal of the art, drive forward and exit back onto Trosper Rd SW. (See map above)
- You may also either hand the art through the window or if it's in the back seat let them open the door, remove the art and then close the door.
- Please wear a mask if you choose to do either of these options as well. We want to make this as safe as possible for everyone by following these guidelines.

Be sure and label your art on the back—include your name, the name of the piece and contact information. The painting at right is one of two Rick is donating. If you have any questions, please contact Rick at:
