

Using Exercises to Hone Your Skills

OAL's own Rick Drescher will demonstrate doing a series of small paintings using wet into wet skies with a silhouetted foreground. Working small provides a fun way to experiment with different techniques you can fine tune for later use in larger paintings. He's developed a video to compensate for the fact that we can't meet in person. It's a technique we hope to use with more presenters in coming months



You know Rick as OAL's President, but you may not know about his rich background in art. As Rick says, "I've been creating art since a very young age--starting with simple pencil drawings and progressing from there." He always knew he wanted to be an artist, but he didn't know what kind. He studied graphic design in college. While there he started painting and illustrating for a college Sci-Fi magazine.

After college, Rick set three goals for himself. "I wanted to create and publish a comic strip; to work in television; and do freelance graphic design." He managed to achieve all three. In 1982 he went to work for KSTW channel 11 (now The CW). In 1990, cartoons he was working on were featured in a Model Railroad magazine. And, as a freelance artist he started creating logos for people and companies.



He didn't take up watercolors until around 2004. "I watched a lot of videos, took workshops and started painting watercolors...not very well. Painting is a journey and it can be a long, long trip. Over the years I've learned a lot of different techniques that I use to create my paintings, whether it's landscapes, florals and even the very fun illustrations of my Strange Critters. It was an amazing pleasure to find the Olympia Art League and to meet all of the fantastic people that make up our membership." Rick hopes you will join us for the launch of our first monthly meeting since the start of Pandemic restrictions.



Ninth Street Women By Mary Gabriel

I am an artist of paint, making discoveries. ---Helen Frankenthaler

If you are looking for a good long read over the next few months of winter and the

pandemic, check out *Ninth Street Women* by Mary Gabriel. It covers the lives of five well known artists (and their friends, lovers, and spouses): Lee Krasner, Elaine de Kooning, Grace Hartigan, Joan Mitchell, and Helen Frankenthaler. Their stories are woven into the backdrop of the political and cultural events of the era: the Great Depression, European immigration, World War II, the Cold War, McCarthyism and the emerging feminist and civil rights movements. It includes the history of their lives, but also the history of the rise of modern art in New York City, that influenced the rest of America and the world. Over 900 pages, including 200 pages of notes and colored pictures.

January 2020 Teresa M. Staal-Cowley made the usual annual New Year's resolutions. Hers were focused on formalizing her art business. "I began working with business coaches David and Alissa Muller. I ended the year with an art display at their new Manda Group Custom Design Center located at 411 4th Avenue West in downtown Olympia." She accomplished her resolution when she formed LLC Teresa Marie Art and Design.



In addition, she received approval for a January 2021 launch of a new nonprofit art ministry--**The A.R.T.I.S.T.S.** The mission is consistent with the acronym--Advocacy, Respect, Truth, Inspire, Spiritual, Teach, Service. The focus of the nonprofit is to raise funds through the arts for vulnerable children, adults, worthy causes and current events. The organization will generate funds through the sale and auction of artists' works with 50% going to the contributing artist and the remainder supporting worthy causes and administrative costs.

The model is based on the 101 Artists Colony Teresa participated in when she lived in Encinitas, CA. They create capital through an annual Arts Alive Banners auction—now in its 20th year. The painting shown is of Teresa and one of her inspirational paintings.
