Join us at our next virtual monthly meeting **Thursday, February 18th 6:30 PM** for a presentation by acrylic artist and expert in all things acrylic—Barbara De Pirro. She will demonstrate how she creates mixed media sculptures and installations.

Her observations of nature have triggered a profound admiration for its brilliance, resilience and its vulnerability. With each project she strives to create a sense of wonder; enticing the viewer to turn that vision outwards into the natural world, nurturing an understanding of that interconnection and encouraging reflection about our relationship with the environment.

De Pirro's artwork has been commissioned and exhibited in museums, galleries, sculpture parks, art centers and public art spaces. She is a member of Northwest Designer Craftsman, Surface Design Association and National Basketry Organization. She is an Artist Trust Fellowship, Residency and GAP (Grants for Artists Project) Grantee, Millay Colony for the Arts and Golden Foundation for the Arts Alum. De Pirro's artwork is highlighted in multiple publications: including Basketry Now; Artistry in Fiber: Sculpture; TextileArt Around the World; Green Art: Trees, Leaves and Roots; World of Threads; Fiber Art Now; and Surface Design Association.

"In high school, art class was the obvious choice over home economics for me, and I decided then I was going to be an 'artist.' By the time college rolled around, my parents had pret-



ty much made it clear that a vocation other than art was in my best interest. I still 'doodled' on every piece of paper which made its way in front of me."

"In 1985, while attending a pharmaceutical seminar in Kingsport, Tennessee I peeked into a conference room while hunting for my next lecture and observed a petite white-haired lady dressed all in black except a brilliant multicolored scarf, which flew behind her as she roller bladed around the room. She stopped to speak to a half dozen people scattered about the room who were engrossed in a watercolor workshop. The skater was an artist and teacher, Judi Betts, who invited me to join the group the next day. I did stay an extra day for the workshop and was hooked!
