Becky Sciullo Will Share Ideas to Sell Your Art!

Mark your calendars for our upcoming monthly meeting. It will be held on Thursday, May 20th starting at 6:30 PM via Zoom. We will be having a fantastic guest speaker, Becky Sciullo. In her presentation, she will share information that can help build a dynamic online presence for your visual art business. She shares ideas to help you SELL YOUR ART! Becky says, "If you've ever worked in sales, you might have heard the adage, 'If you're selling to everyone, you're selling to no one'. This is true with just about every product, including your art". Becky stresses the importance of making sure you are identifying a target audience for your artwork. She says, "This step is critical in setting up your art marketing system. Finding an audience comes easier to some artists than others. This is one of my favorite things to help artists figure out."

Some of the basic steps we will learn about from Becky are:

Step 1—Assess Where You Are

Step 2—Do Your Research

Step 3—Experiment With A Purpose

Step 4—Build Upon What You Learn

April's speaker....

Sandy Allnock

Sandy Allnock's enthusiasm at OAL's April meeting was infectious. She believes everyone is creative and



encourages and supports the development of individual visions and abilities. Sandy shared three suggestions for developing and maintaining you artistic goals.

Chase the dragon: The dragon is something you hesitate to address; something that you find challenging and maybe daunting. This can be an effective way to learn about your goals and process and may expand your abilities and broaden your knowledge. Play with your challenge--no judgements. This helps you learn new aspects about the media, concept, or technique you are working on.

Embrace the challenge: Bring new skills and knowledge to your current art work. Ask yourself what you need to learn. What drives you? Try new things; watch related videos (everything is on You Tube, practically). Experiment with these challenges, and/or take classes related to your area of interest. Nothing is precious, and it's just paper.

Start a habit: Even 10 minutes a day will help you meet your goal. Rather than spend one 6-hour day, work daily for a smaller amount of time to build your knowledge and skills. It's like going to the gym; one long day at the gym is not as helpful as a regular schedule of exercises during the week to build strength and physical tone. Like Sandy, try keeping a sketchbook every day and keep it handy. If nothing else, doodle. Keep the creativity flowing.

To illustrate the process she uses to build confidence and skills in others, she demonstrated the use of Copic alcohol pens with a fast action painting of a lush tulip.

Sandy, artist, crafter, author, instructor, and plein air painter, holds workshops for beginning artists, and those who need encouragement to try.

Art Appreciation Book Group May Theme—Creativity




May: CreativityJune: Baroque/DutchJuly: Les Nabis


