David Lobenberg Will Demonstrate CA Vibe Watercolor Landscape at Our November 18th OAL Zoom Meeting

David Lobenberg of Sacramento will be our featured speaker for the November 18th OAL meeting. David has a Master's Degree in Fine Art from UCLA and has been an adjunct art professor at Sacramento City College. He has over 35 years of teaching experience, including through the University of California Davis extension program, and numerous workshops. He has specialized and exhibited in watercolor and acrylic. He concentrates on portraits and landscapes, has been featured in The Artist's Magazine, and been a commissioned artist for the CA Governor's Office, the Sacramento Opera, Ballet, the U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds Alumni Association, the IMAX Corporation, and the U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials to name a few. At this time he is teaching an on-line portrait class and a drawing class. He will share with us some basic watercolor California Vibe procedures, a process he developed and popularized several years ago, and let us know a little of the on-line classes he is teaching at present. October's Presenting Panel Discussion Review



Sherie' Balko-Nation Lorna Sheveland

This month we had a panel discussion about studio practices from three artists, led by Linda Selsor. The artists were Karla Fowler, Sherie' Balko-Nation, and Lorna Sheveland. The discussion centered on art practices, inspirations, and the artists' studios. Each artist provided a quick biography for us, shared some of their work with us, and talked about methods and techniques.

Karla has been a practicing artist since high school. She found the Puget Sound and the coast inspiring when she moved here from the Midwest several years ago. She is primarily interested in marine subjects, and her primary media is acrylics. She also enjoys mixed media and some collage.

Sherie' has been drawing for years. She has focused on her work for the last five years, developing a distinctive, experimental style by drawing diverse subjects with vibrant colors using inks, colored pencil, and other media.

Lorna focuses on pastels, mixed media and acrylics. She began her studio art practice when she retired nine years ago. Her studio is still being organized after her move to Olympia from Sacramento, although it is structurally complete. She actively practices her art and showed us some examples of her work.

Studios:

Lorna has a new space in her house. It is a large space with a wall unit and 8' of counter space. There is a large table for a variety of projects, including pastel. She has an air purifier to manage the pastel dust. An outside deck where she can paint is also available, weather permitting. Karla has about 400 square feet of space with room for her easels, work in progress, and an office area for the business aspect of her work with a large filing cabinet. There is also space with chairs and a table for visitors, and a fireplace. Sherie' is using a former bedroom for smaller works. For larger works, she uses a dining room table or the garage. Usually she has 6-7 works in progress.

Art Practices:

Each artist uses warm up exercises, journaling and/or practice pages. Daily practice is key for each of them, even if only a few minutes are available. Lorna prefers to have a large chunk of time, like 3-4 hours. Her studio is still new to her, so she is working on developing her schedule. Sherie' always has something going on and uses a journal or practice pages for doodling or drawing practice. She works when she can around her jobs and tries for 2-4 times a week. Karla works at least 3 or 4 days a week in the afternoon, even if it is only for an hour at a time. She does as much as she can when she can.

Maintaining a focus on work, even when uninspired:

Books, journals, past work, Pinterest, and photos are both an inspiration and method to keeping a personal focus on their respective work. Each of them stated a review of works helped refresh and inspire them.

For each artist, experimentation is very important and an important source for ideas. Each of them usually have more than one artwork in process, and will try other media such as collage to play with. Sherie also uses the color wheel and paint swatches to select a palette to use in an artwork.

Sources of inspiration:

Nature and the environment are vital sources of inspiration for each of them, including landscape and water, both fresh and marine. Lorna uses various elements of the natural world, such as wood, in some of her mixed media work. Richard McKinley (Oregon) was a specific artist Lorna mentioned. As a marine painter, Karla loves old wooden and derelict boats, especially the elements of wear and use, such as peeling paint and rust. One of her favorite marine artists is Marshall Johnson. Sherie' uses science fiction, comics, and old movies for inspiration. Her father encouraged her to draw and is also an important influence and inspiration.

Habits that enhance their art practice:


Daily reading of art books and magazines is important. Walking in nature and observing the light, taking photos, and meditation were also mentioned. Learning other arts, such as bonsai or macramé, also spurred creativity and developed new skills. Each of them liked to listen to various programming while working. Karla likes music or local radio. Lorna likes energetic music if she is working on a large piece. Sherie' also likes documentaries and audio about legends or myths.

Ruth loved the magnificent garden she created at her home and spent many hundreds of hours in it. She spent many of her final days admiring the paradise she had created.


