March Guest Speaker: OAL Artist Alice Liou Speaking on Asian Sumi Art

On March 17, 2022, OAL member Alice Liou will take us on a beautiful journey to discover the evolution of Asian Sumi art (ink painting) and how it overlaps with Western art to inspire the creation of fusion modern art forms.

During this PowerPoint presentation, you'll view images of ancient Chinese brush paintings, follow its journey to many countries and centuries, and see how it has evolved into different styles with influences from Zen Buddhism, Literati culture, realism, and abstract art.

Many modern artists have successfully applied the philosophy and techniques of Sumi art to their artwork. Alice will share how some of these accomplished artists make their work even more extraordinary with inspiration from Sumi art..

This presentation will leave you with several new ideas on how to integrate Sumi art into your own artistic creation. Please plan to enjoy this presentation at the OAL Zoom meeting.

A Brief Bio: Growing up in Taiwan, Alice always enjoyed learning Sumi painting, watercolor, and calligraphy from great artists. After her study at the University of Washington, she started a career in the state government while continuing her interest in art. Being a long-time member of the Olympia Art League, Alice joined the Puget Sound Sumi Artists in 2015 and served as their President in 2020 and 2021. February's OAL Zoom Meeting Guest Speaker Review with Robert Burridge

Our speaker for the Olympia Art League monthly Zoom meeting was Bob Burridge, who teaches at the Mendocino Art Center in California.

He now paints full time after a career as a graphic designer and college instructor. His work is in major museums and he has solo exhibitions during the year. He is also on "YouTube", where he discusses his techniques in his short videos "BobBlast".



When asked how he gets started, he replied: "I show up. That is the first step." Then he does a series of practice exercises by quickly painting a simple subject such as a pear or coffee cup. He paints several images about 6"×9". He also sketches and journals in a notebook to work out ideas.

Key ideas he considers important for painting in any style are: concept, composition, color combination, continue doing multiple images of the same thing, and commit.

Bob has developed his own color wheel based on the Munsell color chart. He uses this for his paintings and collages. His approach to design and color is to use a dominant color (80%), a focal color (10%), and two "spice" colors (5% each). The spice colors are colors on either side of the focal color on the color wheel. Use a variety of each color. For example, if your dominant color is red, use several reds-pink, alizaron crimson, magenta, or other hues.

Other tips for painting per Bob are: "Be dedicated and show up every day to practice and develop your ideas. Be interested in what you are doing, not what you think will sell or what your friends/family think you should do. Work without interruptions. Call your art space your studio, even if it is only the top of the washing machine. That helps to get you into the mindset of working on your art."

Bob gave a fun presentation, which is on our website. Plus, check out his videos on "YouTube" for more information and techniques.



Basic Art Supplies for Sumi Painting

Basic Art Supplies for Sumi Painting from Alice Liou

- Sumi brushes (combination hairs for beginners)
- A roll of handmade rice paper (Double Xuan paper)
- A professional ink stick (or liquid ink in a bottle)
- An ink stone (made from natural stone)
- A sheet of wool felt to be placed under the rice paper

Incorporating Sumi Art in Your Current Practice With Any Types of Medium

Emphasize the assent (energy, mood) of the subject

Keep it simple; less is more

Show case the brush strokes or the beauty of calligraphy

Save more empty space for imagination Seek imperfection; break the lines

Find the rhythm: thick & thin; dark & light; large & small
