January Monthly Zoom Meeting Guest Speaker: Lian Quan Zhen

Lian Quan Zhen will demonstrate at our January monthly meeting how to paint undersea life. Lian began sketching and painting in childhood. He continued the hobby while he practiced medicine in Canton Province, China. After immigrating to the U.S. in 1985, he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of California at Berkeley in 1992 and a Master of Architecture Degree from the Massachusetts' Institute of Technology (MIT) in 1996. He specializes in watercolor and Chinese painting is a sought-after artist and teacher in the U.S. and abroad.

Mr. Zhen has been an invited juror for various watercolor exhibitions in the U.S. His paintings hang in numerous institutional and private collections, including the MIT Museum, and they've been featured in specialty magazines and books here and in China.

His five books on Chinese watercolor techniques have been published by North Light Books and have been distributed internationally. He also has a coffee table book out and another book printed with his paintings. You can view a gallery of his paintings and find available workshops and DVD's by going to lianspainting.com. 

November's OAL Meeting and Guest Speaker's Review With Mia Schulte and Richenda Richardson



Our program "The Ins and Outs of Working with Galleries" was led by Mia Schulte (<u>The Artists' Gallery</u> co-operative) and Richenda Richardson (<u>Childhood's End Gallery LLC</u>).

Several elements in common were mentioned by both galleries in determining the perfect fit for both the artist and the gallery. Quality of art and presentation are critical. Is the art well crafted and produced? Do you have a body of original work with your own voice/style? Are you committed to producing your work? Also, the type of work (painting, sculpture, photography e.g.) and the needs and space in the gallery will be considered in the decision of whether or not to show your work. Fees and commissions vary as well. Allowing sales outside of the gallery will be a different decision depending on the gallery. Be sure you understand the requirements and can agree to them. Decide if you are a studio artist who sells online or in your studio, or if you are a gallery artist who will be in a brick and mortar building.

How do you approach a gallery? First, do your research into the gallery and decide if it will work for you. Location, sales, art shown, gallery agreements and requirements are aspects to be considered. Visit the gallery you are interested in. However, it is best to call the gallery or send an email expressing your interest. No cold calls! The right person to talk to may not be there or may be busy with other things when you show up. Cold calls don't leave a good impression. Attend Arts Walk and look at artists work, noting how artwork is framed or displayed, and types of art available. Participate in community service such as charity fundraisers. It's a way to be seen, and to display your work with no commitments (except to the fundraising organization).

<u>The Artists' Gallery</u> is a co-operative gallery managed collectively by the artists in the Capital Mall. Each of the artists are responsible for their own work, as well as the management of the gallery. For example, each artist must show work that is two years old or less. They also assist with sales in the gallery as well as the business of the gallery. A contract must be signed that lists the hours, fees, commission and other requirements.

Applications begin on The Artists' Gallery website (wwwtheartistsgallery.com) in the "Apply Section." Applicants will need an artist statement, a resume, and quality digital photos of their art. If gallery artists see a good fit, you will be called in for a personal interview. Evaluation includes skill and quality of work, type of work (what the gallery and customers need and look for, originals versus prints, jewelry, ceramic, e.g.). It is like hiring someone. The process should determine if the venue and the responsibilities are a good fit for both the artist and the gallery.

<u>Childhood's End Gallery</u> is located in downtown Olympia and was founded in 1970. It is a sole proprietor business managed by the owners, and is the oldest gallery in the US still owned by the original founders. Focusing on originality, craftsmanship, and beauty, they sell both high quality arts and crafts. They believe in building good relationships with their artists and customers. Acting as agents for their artists, they provide sales possibilities from a variety of customers, including local businesses, hospitals, law offices, government officials and local residents as well as travelers who stop by. Childhood's End Gallery also supports online shopping.

At Childhood's End Gallery the artist helps to decide what to show and how to present their work. The gallery requires that the art is original and is owned by the artist. No outside sales are allowed except by prior agreement. The artist provides an artist statement and a resume. Artists must have a body of work prepared for display. Acceptance is influenced by quality and salability of the work. Factors affecting acceptance are work that is different than what is currently being displayed, salable pricing, and a variety of sizes. Shows are booked two years in advance and gallery artists are expected to participate in theme related shows. The owners and a couple of employees will determine who is selected for the gallery. The gallery does not critique work, mentor artists, or appraise artwork.

Both galleries agreed that to succeed at joining a gallery you must be committed to trying. Rejection can be hard, but don't give up until you find the right fit.

• Open to all WA nonprofits whose primary mission is to present or support arts and culture.

- Min budget size is a three-year average of \$25,000.
- Grants are \$2,500 \$25,000 and are unrestricted (no Covid impact required).

• Grant application will be open January 4-31, 2023 The Information session is on Friday, Dec 9 from 11 – noon.

• Funding will provide essential capital to Washington's cultural organizations, including fiscally sponsored and tribal organizations, whose primary mission is to produce or support arts and cultural activities.

• Eligibility: Organizations whose primary mission is to produce or support arts and cultural activities, and who have a minimum three-year average budget of \$25,000. There is no budget cap.
