


March OAL Monthly Meeting Presenter is Roy Lowry Demonstrating Wet on Wet.

Olympia Art League is excited to announce that artist Roy Lowry will be presenting a watercolor demonstration on March 16th, at 6:30 p.m. at the Lacey Community Center.

Roy will demonstrate how to use the wet on wet technique in watercolor painting and show how using the technique defines the true nature of watercolor. He will also demonstrate how to control applying color to a wet surface and how to take the advantage of liquid masking.

Roy Lowry is currently living in Ocean Shores, Washington. Roy's watercolors reflect the mood of the Olympic Peninsula. As a professional designer and colorist, Roy's artwork captures the essence in portraits, wildlife, landscapes, and abstracts. As a graduate in commercial art from Spokane, Washington, Roy worked in Chicago as an illustrator for a sign company winning national awards. As a textile designer, he served as a creative designer for licensed products at a well-known tropical shirt manufacturer, including products for automotive, major league baseball, professional football, collegiate and celebrities helping the tropical shirt transcend all geographic regions.

An interview with one of Olympia Art League's newest members - Valency Genis.

I joined the Olympia Art League in January of 2023, but it had been on my "To Do" list since we moved to the area at the end of 2019. I grew up in Seattle and I have a BFA in painting and drawing from the University of New Mexico.

I make OOAK (one of a kind) faux taxidermy creatures that I sculpt with epoxy clay and then are painted with acrylic and oil paints. The creatures first emerged for my Senior Thesis project/exhibition at the University of New Mexico in 2011.

I am inspired by Jim Henson, Tim Burton and Dr. Seuss, whom I call my "Masters of Art." I like to say my art style is "Modern Escapism," but it is usually categorized as Pop Surrealism





I currently show with Distinction Gallery in Escondido, CA and Haven Gallery in New York. I use Instagram (@Valency) as my main web presence.

Judith Smith was our February OAL presenter. Judith's educational background includes an undergraduate degree in Art History from the University of Pittsburgh, and a graduate degree in Art as Applied to Medicine from the University of Toronto. She began her professional life as an artist in 1965, as the medical artist for the Faculty of Medicine, McGill University in Montreal, Quebec. This first career included black and white illustrations for books, journals, and various teaching materials for medical residents. It also encompassed antique analog animation techniques for the creation of medical teaching films, as well as design and construction of traveling medical exhibits. She now works in pastel and encaustics. She showed us her beautiful examples.





City of Tenino Launches Tenino Metal Banner Art Design Contest

The City of Tenino Creative District and the Art, Recreation, Culture and History (ARCH) Commission announced that they are creating a new public metal banner art project and holding a design contest.

All current residents of Washington State are eligible to submit artwork. Former residents of Tenino to are invited to participate as well. Three Age categories: Students ages 5 to 11 years, Students ages 12 to 18 years Adults ages 18 and up. Each artist may submit up to 10 designs. Artwork created as a group is also acceptable. The winning designs will be displayed on City of Tenino 23 Streetlight poles along Sussex Avenue in the downtown area. Winning artists will be recognized for their work on the City of Tenino's webpage.

"The goal is to provide imagery that represents the history, culture, recreation and/or natural beauty of Tenino. Celebrating what makes a place special both in the past and in the present makes a strong community and a great place to visit. We think 23 pieces of public art will help us do that" said Mayor Wayne Fournier.

Submissions must be received on or before March 15th, 2023 at 5pm PST.

This public art project is being funded in part by the Washington State Arts Commission Certified Creative Districts Capital Projects Program.
