January Guest Speaker Tom Lynch



Tom Lynch will be our speaker for the January 20, 2022 meeting. Tom attended the American Academy of Art and the University of Illinois. He lives near Chicago and has been referred to as one of the nation's premier watercolorists. Tom is the author of numerous books on watercolor techniques and has hosted an award winning PBS Art Series. He has been cited in national and international publications. His paintings are

in private and corporate collections throughout the world and he has taught workshops internationally. "Who's Who in American Art" has listed him and he has been the invited guest artist and judge in numerous exhibitions. His accomplishments include a one-person exhibition in Paris, France, honorary membership in the Canadian Watercolor Society, and the featured artist for U.S. Open Golf Championships and PGA events and tournaments.

That's just a short list, but in other words, Tom is GOOD. I can vouch that he is a top-notch instructor as I've taken an inperson workshop with him and several on-line workshops. Whenever I pick up a brush, I instinctively hear him and consider his comments. Whatever medium you work in, you will learn from him. You can search for him at artacadamylive.com. The details have not been fully worked out yet, but he plans to record his part of the meeting so members have a month to view it again. To keep him awake, however, we might want to begin his presentation at our time of 6:30 p.m. (his time 8:30 p.m.), then later have our regular meeting. Look for emails in January, since we won't have another newsletter before the meeting.

Tom will demonstrate rescuing "failed" paintings. In addition, as an extra bonus, at no extra charge, he will review members' original work and critique them in writing. If you would like him to critique a water-color painting, he's asked that I collect the original watercolor and send them to him all at once. Please contact me to arrange getting them to me by December 31st. A couple of dollars (or more, depending on weight) might help with mailing costs. He will pay for return shipment. Other paintings in acrylic or other mediums, he will take a look at by email. I will send all of those at the same time to him by email. Please get those photos to me by December 31st. I hope you take advantage of this offer. He will be a big help.

David demonstrated the woman on the left at the OAL Zoom meeting. It was a fun new learning style for many of us. Thank you David for sharing your evening with us.






