February OAL Monthly Meeting Presenter is Jon Bradham

We are delighted to have Jon Bradham with us in person at our OAL monthly meeting on Thursday, February 15th at 6:30 p.m. at the Lacey Community Center. We are looking forward to his presentation of casein watercolor. He uses this medium to prepare for his oil paintings. Much to his amazement many collectors wish to buy his casein paintings. He sells both casein's and oil paintings. This is a new medium to many of us and I'm sure you'll find his presentation interesting.

Jon has been drawing and painting since early childhood. However, he has also been going blind since childhood due to a condition called Keratoconus. Twenty years ago, his eye doctors had exhausted all the known solutions and his eyesight had become so poor that he was on the verge of giving up his lifelong passion, drawing and painting. Luckily he found an eye doctor in Seattle that restored his sight through cornea transplant. Jon said, "I am so thankful for this doctor and for the organ donors! I use this new lease on my eyesight every day to improve my craft as an artist."



Jon said why he paints is, "I experience joy when I see beauty in a landscape, in a cityscape, in wildlife, in people, and I want to communicate and share that joy with others. When I see a scene that captivates me, I unconsciously start painting it in my mind. As I look back on paintings, no matter when painted, I can remember the day and what inspired me. I re-experience that initial joy when my art makes a connection with another."

Getting Acquainted

Introducing-Paige Dietrich

Hello! I am a native Washingtonian and have lived in Olympia for 16 years. I have always enjoyed occasional creative endeavors, but my life has been occupied with family and work. Over the



summer of 2020, fatigued and a little stir crazy from working full time in our spare bedroom/office/storage room, I decided to take a few watercolor classes on Skillshare. And so, the obsession began. I started a daily practice of doing a little art in the morning before

work, I opened an Instagram account, and started to see all of the amazing artwork posted there. What a brilliant opportunity to interact with and be inspired by artists all over the world! Last April, I



started joining the South Sound Urban Sketchers to sketch outdoors and also learned of the Olympia Art League. What a wonderful group of people I've met!

I really enjoy working with ink and watercolor, and I have dabbled in acrylics, colored pencils, and mixed media. Most recently, I've been trying out gouache and learning



to linocut. I am still working, and for me, art is simply a pursuit of joy. If you are inclined, you can view my efforts on Instagram at @paigeldietrich. I've joined the

January OAL Meeting Speaker Review— Carol Smith Myer

Our speaker for the evening was Carol Smith Myer, an oil painter who is a new member of OAL and new to the Olympia area. She recently moved from the Bay Area. Using her own photo of a stream with vegetated banks of reeds, trees, and a clear blue sky she demonstrated how to focus on light while painting a landscape. Generally, she does not use the blues and greens associated with the landscape initially. Instead, for this painting, by using warm and cool colors, she first blocked out the basic shapes and features of the landscape as an underpainting. She chose magenta for her cool shadows, and ochre for warm, lighter areas for the vegetation, placing these colors to block in the light and shadow of the landscape. She mixed these colors to define the changing light of the sky, which was warm. For the water, even though water is cool, she started with rose because the stream was in the sunlight.



Carol does not use the colors for the final painting (blues, greens, e.g.) until the landscape features have been delineated by placing light areas (ochre) and shadows (magenta). Then, when the underpainting is complete, she begins to use the colors she sees in the landscape, matching the values and temperature as determined by the underpainting. As these colors are applied over the underpainting, she allows the colors of the underpainting to show through for movement and interest. For example, initially the water was painted in rose. In the final painting, the water now appears blue, with flashes of rose. The vegetation, now various shades of green, grey, and gray-violet, and other colors, also showed the magenta and ochre of the underpainting.

Carol painted on an oil-primed linen-covered, gesso wooden panel. Her palette included veridian, rose, lemon yellow, Indian yellow, umber, magenta, cerulean blue, and ochre. Two flat brushes were used, one for warm colors, the other for cool colors. Michael Harding brand is her preferred paint, but she will use any good quality oil paint. As she painted, she talked about her process. When painting, she pointed out that painting the colors present was key. She said, "Comparing the colors and using the presence of light and shadow will give a sense of the land. Look at nature for clues and for colors. And...know when to stop."

When her painting was finished, it was impressionistic, the colors harmonized, and was amazing!

Carol is a member of the Artist's Gallery and shows her work there. Carol enjoys teaching this impressionist way of seeing and conveying light with color, to new and experienced artists. She gives classes, in any medium, on alternate Tuesdays from 10-1pm. Call the Artist Gallery for more details.

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


Welcome New Members!

Art tours at the Washington Governor's Mansion have been APPROVED for Wednesday March 6th & 13th guided by Pat Keith from OAL. The time of both tours is 12 to 1 pm. Only 25 members can participate each day. Everyone going on tour must present a photo ID to the security guard to enter. The tours are FREE.

If you are not familiar where the Mansion is located, it is suggested to do a "drive by" in advance. The Department of Enterprise (DES) website provides a good MAP with the Mansion location and the route for the FREE sightseeing/ visitor bus that goes nearby the Mansion. The on line map provided by DES also gives the location of ALL FREE parking spots, including parking spots for the disabled on Capital Campus. It gives times, route and other details as well. 
